### **25<sup>th</sup> ISGF WORLD CONFERENCE** **21<sup>st</sup> –26<sup>th</sup> August 2008 Austria**

**Five members of the UK Adult Scout Alliance were amongst nearly 500 ISGF members from 48 countries at the World Conference in Vienna.**

The opening ceremony for the conference was held in the auditorium of the historic University of Vienna. Following the parade of the Flags of participating countries and welcome to all participants we were treated to Viennese music played by a ladies orchestra and dancing of traditional Viennese waltzes. Inspired by the lovely music couples from the audience danced up and down the aisles and thus the Conference had begun.

Following coffee the business side of the Conference started and continued over the next few days. There were debates on constitutional matters, votes by delegates on amendments, presentations by member countries, workshops, Regional and national meetings etc.

A World market was held under the arcades surrounding the charming University quadrangle where counties displayed and sold local produce and gave a flavour of how they lived.

On Sunday afternoon all could partake in organised excursions – some to locations away from Vienna and some of us went on guided tours around the streets of beautiful Vienna and learnt some of its history. That evening we visited a typical small village Inn sampling the local wine. Following the last business session on Monday we were taken by coach to the outskirts of Vienna and we could look down on the city from on high.

Every day we were treated to lovely meals – all eating together for lunches in the cellar rooms under the Town Hall. The main room of the Town Hall with its carvings, gold and chandeliers was the setting for the civic reception and buffet meal given by the Lord Mayor and the city. Then there was an Austrian Dinner Show and a farewell dinner where the entertainment was by a local Scout Group.

The Conference sessions were long but quite well attended. The Austrians did so well to get all this organised in a short time. We had free travel passes for the whole time we were there which gave us a chance to explore the city, and the weather was warm and sunny.
